



Alphabet Story

Students write a story using vocabulary words or words that are new to them.

Level - 4-5

Originated by Treetop Publishing

Students will learn how to use new vocabulary words that begin from A to Z by writing a story including them. A list for word options would help the students progress with their writing, and would help keep on track with the word types that would be beneficial for creativity.

Student Instructions:

1. Choose one word from the list that begins with each letter from the alphabet and make a new list on a sheet of paper.
2. Using the last few pages of your Bare Book, make a glossary of the words from your list, using the definition from a dictionary.
3. Make a rough draft of your story using the words from your list at least once - they do not have to be used in alphabetical order.
4. Proofread your story making sure that all the words are used in their proper form, and editing any errors in spelling or sentence structure.
5. Write your story in the Bare Book, leaving room for illustrations.
6. Underline the words from your list in the story.
7. Illustrate the cover of your book.
8. Write a paragraph "About the Author" on the inside of the back cover of the book - you can include a photo if you wish.
